

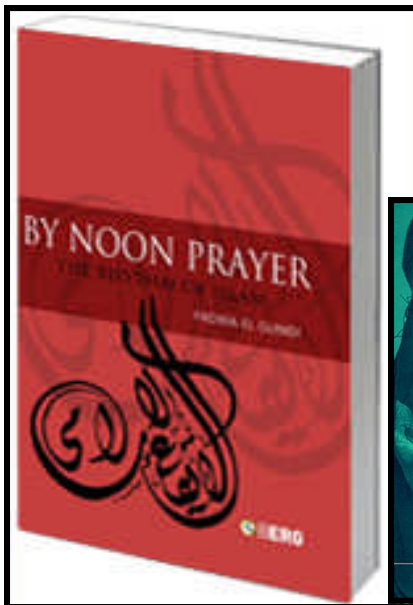

She is a past president of the Middle East Section of the American Anthropological Association (AAA) as well as a former president of the AAA's Society for Visual Anthropology. Now in its third printing, her book *Veil: Modesty, Privacy and Resistance*, has been translated into Indonesian and other languages. Her latest book is *By Noon Prayer: The Rhythm of Islam*.
